Melton Constable's Railway Heritage



You may have noticed that there are two brick pillars that support a metal arch on the grass area, near the industrial site at the junction of the road to Hindolveston. This is a memorial to the village's Railway Heritage.

Melton Constable Parish Council had originally planned to create this memorial where the pillars and arch have stood since the railway station was built. The arch and the steps down to the engine sheds and station were used by all railway workers, going to and from work. Unfortunately the steps and supporting wall are in very poor condition and the cost of renovating them was prohibitive. Also the railway entrance is very close to the road and there is very little space for any signage. The railway arch and steps are in fact on private land owned by Preva Produce, (which were MBM and Beesons). William Beeson of Preva Produce has been very supportive with this project and has financed the building of the pillars and arch for which we are very grateful.

I hope you all had a good summer and managed to get a bit of a break either by going away or with time at home, or a staycation as they call it these days.


As some as you will know, the Bishop of Norwich has asked me to take on a new role, as Rural Dean of Holt. This job will be on top of my work as

The Welcome to Melton Constable leaflet is awaiting final translation checks and printing. It has been produced in a format which will enable updates to be made by Councillors at no further cost. Volunteers are requested in each street to welcome new arrivals to the village and to hand out the leaflets.

A plaque for the Railway Arch is to be sited. A fund raising coffee morning is planned to cover the costs. This will be held on the 14th October at 10 am at Burgh Parva Hall. All will be very welcome!

The Scope charity clothing recycling bin was placed on the bus shelter site by Highways without reference to Council. After discussions it was agreed that a request be made for its removal. It was considered that a precedent could otherwise be set for any charity to have a bin placed there and that residents had sufficient opportunity to recycle clothing with the number of clothing recycling bags that are delivered through post boxes.

Allotment asbestos waste continues to be a problem. NNDC have been asked for help with the cost of removing this.

Quotes have been received which are too high for the Parish Council to pay. It was noted that the waiting list has been considerably reduced. Tenants who have not been cultivating plots have received letters.

The street lighting project is now completed and a final report sent to EEDA.

Ideas for the development of the Parish Website are welcomed and it is intended that a website policy document be produced. Further ways to improve communications to the public include a stall to be manned by Councillors at the Yesu Autumn Fair, to be held at the Country Club on 22nd October and the Co-Op has been approached for a request to site another notice board on their building.

The provision of Grit Bins is to be investigated and BT will be requested to repair the telephone box.

The preservation of the Water Towers as part of the village's heritage was discussed and the owner will be approached to ask what future plans there may be for these.

It was agreed that registration of the village beacon as part of the nationwide Queen's Diamond Jubilee Beacon celebration next year will be submitted.

The monthly financial statement and payments to be made were approved.

The dates of the 2012 Annual Parish Council meeting was agreed to be Tuesday 15th May and the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Tuesday 3rd April.

Local Lives -

Having lived in Briston for twenty years, I am very conscious of how fortunate we are in having such a wealth of excellent food suppliers in the village and neighbouring Melton Constable. In my travels, I think it fair to say that I have not found another country district so well provided for. It was while musing over the list that I found myself wondering about the origins of the Norfolk Larder, supplier of crustaceans and fresh fish.

This family run business, situated off Mill Road, opposite the village green, is a very impressive establishment recently constructed on the site of the original premises.

Ultra modern in appearance this Eco Centre processing plant is the only one of its type in Norfolk. The man responsible for the business is David Chambers, who immediately impresses with his outspoken frankness. To David a spade is most definitely a spade.

Born at Denham, Buckinghamshire in 1947 David attended the local village school which was little more than a hall divided into classrooms with the aid of hanging curtains. Denham film studios were not far away and his mother in fact worked there and would sometimes wear dresses obtained from the props department. Having moved on to Middle School it became apparent that he suffered from a form of word blindness, nowadays called dyslexia. (Chambers dictionary states: great difficulty in learning to read or spell not caused by lack of intelligence.) Unfortunately, it did lead to considerable teasing from the other children, which David counteracted with his fists.

He developed a great enthusiasm for fishing and took every opportunity to use his rods in the local rivers, lakes and occasionally the sea, little realising that later commercial fishing would be his life. His father had a dread of water and would do his best to dissuade David from taking risks by venturing out in boats.

He left school at fourteen and a half to join the Cold Stream Guards as a junior guardsman and soon found himself boxing for them and competing in cross-country runs. He achieved considerable success in these sports although not without some drama. On one occasion, he found he was required to enter the ring to fight his best friend, something neither he nor his friend was prepared to do. In spite of remonstrations, they were ordered to box but still refused. As the officers and senior NCOs shouted and raved, with faces turning more purple by the second, still the friends would not exchange blows. David issued a challenge that he would fight any man they put in the ring, be he big or little, but would not strike his mate. In true army fashion they both finished in the guardroom on a charge, which probably read "Conduct prejudicial to good army discipline." David bought himself out of the army after serving four and a half years and took up a career in pest control. He later worked for 'Rentokil' in North Norfolk and around 1971 his father came across New Hall Farm in Briston, which was for sale and after a brief negotiation a purchase was made. David's love of fishing developed into ambitions regarding crab fishing and after a couple of years crewing on boats along the Norfolk coast, to learn the methods and technique, he was confident enough to use his savings to purchase his first boat, an eighteen footer called "Norfolk Girl". Not that this was all he needed. One had also to buy the pots, lines and numerous other items before you could start trying to earn a living. With sheer determination and hard work, he succeeded and even after a later boat "Pin Tail" sunk, he persevered. He gave a great smile as he recalled the Rev. John Blacker calling to commiserate at the loss and wonders if he wanted to go to sea to offer a blessing over the wreck. "Pin Tail" was later recovered and put back in service.

Next month the business prospers but not without some difficulties and confrontation. JW.

I have heard a lot in the news lately about PPI and I think I may have been mis-sold one of these insurance policies when I took out a loan. What should I do now?

There has been an important new High Court ruling about Payment Protection Insurance, or PPI. This is insurance you can take out when you take out a loan or a mortgage, to cover your repayments if you get ill or lose your job.

Some people have been sold PPI without being told that it is something separate to the loan they are taking out. This is mis-selling. Other people have been mis-sold PPI because the policy doesn't cover their circumstances and they would never be able to make a claim on it - for example self-employed people who were sold policies excluding self-employment.

The High Court ruling means that firms selling PPI will have to review past sales of their policies, even where customers have so far not complained. Firms may need to contact all past and present customers to find out if they want to complain.

If you think you were mis-sold PPI, you can complain to the firm that sold you the policy. If they refuse to deal with your complaint or to give you a refund for the policy, you can make a further complaint to the Financial Ombudsman Service.

Banks who have sold PPI are working towards contacting customers who may be affected. They advise that if you have already made a complaint, you do not need to do anything. Your bank will be in touch with you as soon as they have processed your complaint.

If you are unhappy with the outcome of a complaint, you can complain to the Financial Ombudsman Service.
